The Role of the Parent in Teaching the Children the Basics of Islam

As for what follows:

Parents have a specific role in teaching their children the basics of the religion of Islam and their failure to do so has serious consequences on the child and society at large. The parent is the first teacher of the child and is in many ways the cause for the child's rectification or corruption. Allah has made parents responsible for saving their children from the Hell-fire. Allah says:

O you who believe! Ward off from yourselves and your families a Fire (Hell)

Imam Qurtubi rahimahullah said in the commentary of this verse:

"So he teaches him [the child] the halal and haram. And he prohibits him from disobedience and sin and other than that from the rulings".

And so, the only way parents can protect their children from the Hell-fire is by teaching them the religion. The Prophet sallahu alayhi wa salam said:

I am to you like a father to his son, and I teach you. So when you go to relieve yourselves, do not face the Qiblah or turn your backs towards it.' He ordered us to use three pebbles, and he forbade us to use dung and bones, and he forbade cleaning oneself with the right hand.

Imam Abul-Hasan as-Sindhi rahimahullah said in the explanation of the Hadith:

His statement: Verily I am to you like a Father to his son: that is in everything he needs. He does not care about what is usually shied away from mentioning. This is an introduction to what he [sallahu alayhi wa salam] will clarify to them from the etiquette of using the washroom since many people are shy to mention it especially during eating or dining.

Imam al-Khattabi rahimahullah said:

In this is a clarification of the obligation of obeying the parents and that it is obligatory upon them to discipline their children and **that they teach them what they need from the affairs of their religion.**

Today, puberty has become a taboo in our Muslim communities. How many adolescents reach puberty unaware of it and its rulings? Parents have become so shy to discuss this natural process with their sons and daughters that the youth are left confused and isolated. They are left to seek answers from their friends at school or the internet or even from the disbelievers! To make things worse, classes given at local masjids do not offer much guidance on the issue or at least not publicly. So parents need educate their children, whether it about the method of making ghusl or the rulings associated with menstruation. Allah, the Exalted says;



but Allah is not shy of (telling you) the truth.

And the Prophet sallahu alayhi wa salam said:



Verily Allah the Exalted does not shy from the telling the Truth

[Saheeh Jami no. 1852]

So parents should not be shy of educating their children. The consequences of such negligence is severe. Children ignorant of the basics of their religion are harmful to themselves and others. Their

misguidance and ignorance can eventually be traced back to the parents, if they neglected their duties.

Ibn Qayyim rahimahullah said:

"If you reflect on the corruption of the children, you will see that most of it is by the parents"

And he said:

"And the corruption of most of children comes from their parents and their neglect towards them and abandoning teaching them the obligation of the religion and its Sunan"
